707-4. **Stephen Austin** was born in 1797 in Georgia. He was married circa 1832 in Boone County MO to Emily J. Austin, b. circa 1819 in Mercer County KY, dau. of Benjamin and Elizabeth (Bradley) Austin. Stephen d. on 27 February 1872 in Linn County MO at age 75. He and Emily had eight children b. in MO: Angeline Austin b. 3 February 1833 in Livingston, Linn County; James Austin b. in October 1850 in Chillicothe, Livingston County, he d. 4 May 1871 in Linn County; John Austin b. circa 1838; Joseph Austin b. circa 1839; Sarah E. Austin b. circa 1841; Benjamin F. Austin b. circa 1843; John B. Austin b. circa 1846; and James L. Austin b. circa 1849. Seeking Stephen Austin's parents.

707-5. **Thomas Austin** was born in New York in 1797, and died in 1824 age 26. His son Orestes O. Austin was b. circa 1821 in Fulton County NY, he was age 34 in the 1855 census for Mindon, Montgomery County NY. His first wife Mary (Wagner) Austin was age 33 in that census, born in Montgomery County. He married second on 1 October 1862 to Emma Josephine Austin, b. 28 March 1840 in Wallingford, Connecticut. Orestes had daughters Minerva b. 16 January 1845, and Emma Brockway b. 25 January 1879. He died on 21 June 1889 in Mindon. 707-6. **John Austin** was b. ca. 1785 in Chester County, Pennsylvania. He m. circa 1805 in Chester County to Mary Pyle, b. 1785 in Chester County, dau. of Ebenezer Pyle (1760-1834) and Sarah Clark. Their children b. in Chester County: William Austin b. 1807, Ebenezer Pyle Austin b. 1807, Elizabeth b. 1810, James b. 1814, John b. 1819 and Mary Ann b. 1822. John was listed on tax rolls of West Caln Township in Chester County as a "plasterer" in 1807, 1814 & 1821. The family moved "from Coatesville PA" to Wayne County, Indiana in 1826 and settled in Richmond IN with Quakers in 1835. Family notes state that John Austin was one of five boys whose red-headed father was known as "Jersey Red." One boy went to VA, another to Meigs Station OH, two to NY, and John to Harrisburg PA.
