

QUERIES

146-1. **David Austin** was born 30 May 1833, died on 19 June 1859, was buried in the Rose Creek Cemetery in Austin, Mower County, Minnesota. Seeking his parents.

146-2. **Amanda Phylena Austin** born 15 January 1854 Pelham, New Hampshire, married James Madison Noyes, d. 6 March 1920 in Londonderry, N.H. Seeking parents.

146-3. **Jason Lee Austin** was born on 11 June 1800 in Connecticut. He was married to Eunice Page, born in November 1801 in Connecticut. They both died in Genesee County, Michigan – Eunice on 22 March 1864, Jason on 1 October 1888. Both are buried there in the Evergreen Cemetery. Would like know Jason Lee Austin's parents.

146-4. **Anthony Austin** was born circa 1806 in Ohio. He married Urania Harman born circa 1828 in Illinois. She was listed by the nickname "Reany" in the 1850 Bond County, Illinois census, and by "Yurana" and "Urana" in the 1860 and 1870 Washington County, Illinois census. Would like anything on parents of Anthony and Urania.

146-5. **Peyton W. Austin** was born circa 1862 in Henry County, Virginia, perhaps the son of Albert G. Austin and Matilda B. Martin. He was married at age 24 on 28 April 1886 in Henry County, Virginia to Belle Austin age 28. Their marriage certificates lists his parents as — and M. Austin, her parents as J. and — Austin. Peyton and Belle had four children: Elva M. Austin (my great-grandmother), Annie L. Austin, Jettie M. Austin, and Moten C. Austin. Need the names of Peyton's parents.

146-6. **Elezabeth Coleman Austin**, usually referred as E. Coleman Austin, was a 2nd Lieutenant in Company C, Regiment 28 of the North Carolina infantry. He married Barbara Herman and had three children: Ann Austin, Martha Austin, and Sylvanus Austin. Sylvanus apparently changed his name to Sylvester, and is buried with his wife Gulomia along side Lieutenant Austin's grave near Askov, Minnesota. I am wondering how these Austins came to Minnesota, and whether there is any record as to how Lieutenant Austin – who died at Gettysburg – came to be buried so far north in Minnesota.

146-7. **John S. Austin** b. 26 September 1852, m. on 26 January 1879 to Rose Curtis, b. 24 June 1859. They had three daughters: Genevieve Lillian Austin m. – Young; Bertha Mildred Austin m. Raymond E. Putnam; and Harriet Curtis Austin m. — Phillips. The Putnams lived in Syracuse, New York in the 1930 census. I located the small family bible originally owed by Rose Curtis Austin in our local church library – the Old Tennent Presbyterian Church next to the Monmouth Battlefield in Tennent, New Jersey. Would like to turn this bible over to a descendant of one of John and Rose's daughters.
